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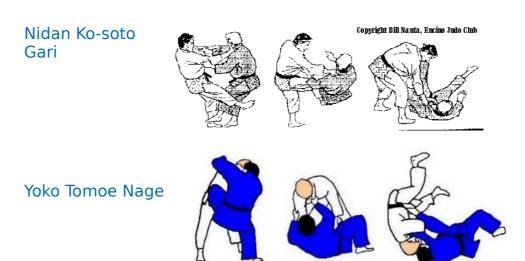

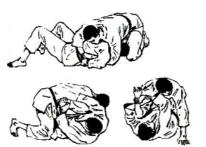

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Ne Waza turnovers

Uke is on his hands and knees, tori turns Uke over by grabbing Uke's arms from underneath Uke, pushing Uke with the chest, and placing the arm closer to the head under Uke's head, the other hand between Uke's legs, and performs Yoko Shiho Gatame.
